## 3. Financial Report

- (a) Financial Reporting ending February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
  - Our expenses are at 79.4% of an expected budget of 91.7%. Still under budget so far this year with more work / receipts to come in the AGM and ABIC, and marketing.
  - There are no out of the ordinary expenses to discuss at this time. We continue to have a strong balance sheet. Our Equity portion of our investments are marginally higher at 20.3%, compared to the board instructions of 20%. For March, if it is over 20%, it will only be due to fluctuations in the market.

- (a) ACFA Update:
  - Approximately 600 in attendance at ABIC and are pleased with how the conference went
  - Captive insurance is looking very promising, this is a study that ACFA has been looking at over the past year and will be presenting to ABP in the near future.
- (b) Western Stock Growers Association
  - No representative in attendance.
- (c) Alberta Grazing Leaseholders Association: Forbes
  - AGLA's AGM in Lethbridge was very well attended.
  - Minister Loewen attended and announced in the coming weeks he will be announcing a ministries advisory council for the recreational access regulation review that will be coming out in the spring.
- (d) Feeders Association of Alberta
  - Yearly audit with ATB to update FAA's contract with ATB and Alberta Breeder Finance Inc.
- (e) Alberta Veterinary Medical Association: Dr Kutryk
  - No representative was in attendance.
- (f) Alberta Auction Markets Association:
  - Auction markets have been busy through Jan and February but starting to show numbers tightening up as we approach April.
- (g) CCA Update:

- CCA AGM is in Ottawa March 18<sup>th</sup> March 21st
- Hillmer appointed as the Alberta Representative for CCA.
- Discussions were held by the board on the upcoming CCA AGM meetings.
- (h) Research Committee & BCRC
  - ABP Research Committee hosted a Research Showcase at Old's College on March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
  - Two representatives are to be elected by the research committee for BCRC, the positions are currently held by Graeme Finn and John Doherty and both individuals are open to continuing.

#### 6. Decision Items

(a) Board Resolutions

"Be it Resolved That CFIA (Canadian Food Inspection Agency) advocate for the removal of all present restrictions and reporting requirements currently in effect due to BSE."

- 2) Whereas The beef industry has room for growth through genetic improvement. The industry is not taking full advantage of this potential the same way the dairy industry is. Dairy can target desired genetics with pinpoint accuracy and make exponential improvements. The beef industry is also at risk of multi-national companies identifying superior genetics and having ownership. I feel that as an industry we must take an issue that needs to be defined and to develop a strategy to move forward.
- "Be it Resolved That Alberta Beef Producers explores ways to work with commercial and seed stock producers, genetic companies, researchers and applied research associations and funders like RDAR to gather mass data and identify superior genetics in a non- biased way. I believe a collaborative approach would benefit all

## stakeholders and Alberta Beef Producers could be in a position to facilitate this."

The above resolution was brought forward to the Alberta Beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was defeated by the Alberta Beef Producers Board. It was discussed that this was out Alberta Beef Producers capacity and Alberta Beef Producers would not be able to achieve a collaborative approach in a positive strategic manner.

3) Whereas Lab Grown Meats threaten the integrity of the Livestock Industry.

## "Be it Resolved That ABP lobby the Provincial Government and Federal Government to ban lab grown meats or feed from being produced in Canada or imported."

The above resolution was brought forward to the Alberta Beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was defeated by the Alberta Beef Producers Board. The Alberta Beef Producers Board of directors discussed the issue of Lab Grown Meats and concluded that Lab Grown Meats is not an immediate threat to the Livestock Industry.

4) Whereas to differentiate the cow/calf price insurance program that are limiting to the cow/calf sector if their ability to purchase cow/calf insurance that properly covers the largest expense which is feed.

## "Be it Resolved That ABP advocate to the Alberta Government and AFSC to explore options to lengthen the purchase period."

The above resolution was brought forward to the Alberta Beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was defeated by the Alberta Beef Producers Board. The Alberta Beef Producers Board of directors discussed the resolution and concluded that the resolution is redundant and referred to the Alberta Beef Producers policy manual 41.A.

Business Risk Management Program Policy

- 4.1 ABP shall support programming that facilitates risk management for all types of producers, including, but not limited to, programs for
- (a) Price Risk that is permanently available to producers and available year around,

5) Whereas The Provincial Government needs tentative ideas regarding water rights on surface water

## "Be it Resolved That ABP lobby on behalf of producers to secure our right to access surface and deep-water wells and dug outs."

The above resolution was brought forward to the Alberta beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was carried by the Alberta Beef Producers Board. "Be it resolved That ABP advocate on behalf of producers to secure access rights to surface water, deep water wells and dug outs and referred to the ABP Policy Manual 10.3."

- 10.3 Water legislation, regulations and policies must include consideration of
- (a) priorities and economics,
- (b) protection of historical water uses and users,
- (c) development of a flexible, transparent, and efficient system for water allocation transfers,
- (d) increased flexibility of agriculture uses, and,
- (e) exploration of all possible solutions to water supply challenges.

"Be it Resolved That ABP develop a provincial and national climate program that promotes existing grassland habitat carbon program."

The above resolution was brought forward to the Alberta Beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was amended to read "Be it Resolved That Alberta Beef Producers engage a provincial and national climate program that promotes existing grassland habitat carbon reimbursement program."

- 7) Whereas Foot and mouth disease has been spreading worldwide. and the likelihood of it reaching the Canadian beef herd is a reality in our industry.
- "Be it Resolved That ABP develop a committee consisting of all cloven-hoofed animals' including wildlife species to develop an emergency response plan with the CFIA and to have a date of completion."

The above resolution was brought forward to the ABP Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was amended to read "Be it Resolved That ABP engage with all cloven-hoofed animals including wildlife species to develop an emergency response plan with CFIA and Animal Health Canada to have a date of completion."

The above amended resolution was brought forward again to the Alberta Beef Producers Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was carried. "Be it resolved That ABP advocate on behalf of producers to develop an emergency response plan with CFIA and Animal Health Canada to have a

date for completion and referred to the ABP Policy Manual 17.2."

Disease Outbreaks Policy

17.2 ABP will work with CFIA and associated stakeholders to provide clear and efficient emergency response protocols for producers.

The above resolution was brought forward to the ABP Board of Directors on March 14th, 2024, and was amended to read "Be it Resolved That ABP lobby the government to change the wildlife damage program to include extended grazing systems and extend the end date of October 31st."
